## **Deborah Manzanares, Baylor University**

## Saturday Night Keynote: Advisor of the Year 2022

Deborah Manzanares is the only Alpha Lambda Delta advisor to win the Executive Director Advisor Award three times, in 2007, 2014, and 2017. She revived the Baylor chapter in 2006. Over her 16 years as chapter advisor, Baylor University has seen two Graduate Fellows, six Stemler Study-Abroad Scholars, and five Trow Undergraduate Scholars. Deborah's leadership helped the Baylor chapter transition from an inactive chapter to a chapter hosting three programs per week – one service, one academic, one social. Already a large chapter, during a global pandemic she was able to increase membership by 48% from 2020 to 2022, making Baylor's chapter Alpha Lambda Delta's largest chapter with 1,215 new members inducted last year.
